



# Autumn Term 2025

## Year 1 Curriculum Newsletter

**English** This term, Beech Class will immerse themselves in a range of different texts and genres. The children will begin the term with a focus on the basics and securing good sentence writing while building vocabulary through class discussion. The children will have the opportunity to do their first independent write including planning. In the second half term, the children will explore poetry and will use onomatopoeia, repetition, similes and rhyme to create an effect when writing. The children will end the term by reading the fiction book, *The Queen's Hat*, and explore how narrative approaches are used to engage the reader. Then the children will use a range of techniques to innovate and write their own story based on the text. There will also be a focus on the essentials of grammar including capital letters, plurals, suffixes and pronouns.

**Maths** The children will begin the term by investigating place value to ten and revisiting the fundamental skills they learnt in Early Years. They will be learning to count with accuracy, comparing groups, ordering numbers and how to use a number line to count on. Next, they will develop their knowledge of addition and subtraction. In this unit, the children will learn to use a part-whole model to aid their understanding that any number can be composed of two or more parts. They will also learn the symbols for addition and subtraction and how to use these operations. Towards the end of the term they will learn to write number sentences in multiple ways and use this knowledge to support their exploration of addition fact families.

**Science** The children will begin their science lessons by investigating the seasons. They will discover what kinds of trees and animals share our space during autumn, as well as comparing the different shape, size and colour of leaves. As a class, the children will choose a tree to revisit throughout the year, and will observe how it changes across the four seasons. For the remainder of the term, Beech Class will be exploring the topic of the human body and senses. We will begin the topic by investigating and naming the different parts of the body and discussing whether all bodies are the same. We will then discover how our senses help us explore and make sense of the world.

**Art / Design and Technology** In Art, we will focus on the theme of spirals. The children will begin to explore mark making and make drawings as a result of observation. In D&T, the children will learn about mechanisms. They will explore mechanisms by making our own moving storybook.

**Computing** To begin the term, the children will learn how to use their own details to login on Chromebooks, as well as why a password is important. On Purple Mash they will using different tools to paint and completing puzzles and games. In the second half of the term, the children will become Data Explorers. They will think carefully about grouping and sorting, and understand how information can be stored on a computer.

**Geography** This term's focus will be 'What is it Like Here?' The children will use an aerial photograph of the local area to identify the name of the village they go to school in. Later in the term the children will make a map of the school, including its key features, and will plan for how they would improve three areas of the playground.

**History** During the second half of the term the children will be immersing themselves in the topic of 'How am I Making History?' The children will engage in language rich discussions, order photographs on a simple timeline and explain why memories and events are special, and why they are celebrated.

**Music** This term's topics are 'Hey You' and 'Banana Rap'. The children will listen and appraise hip hop style music. In 'Hey You' the children will make up (compose) their own rap and in the second half of the term we will explore an action song and practicing for our Christmas production.

**RE** The big question of the term is, 'Is it important to belong?' First, the children will look at the theme of belonging in Christianity and the significance baptism in belonging to a church. Then, they will investigate belonging in Judaism and how Mitzvot (good deeds) make Jewish people feel like they belong to God.

**PSHE** This term, the children will look at different types of relationships and what makes a good friend. They will talk about their feelings and emotions and how actions can affect people differently. The children will continue to learn about emotions and the importance of managing those emotions and different ways to relax. We will also cover health and hygiene by exploring good hand washing and keeping safe in the sun.
